Hi Ken & Chris.

I need to clarify what Luke is asking for here (we had a long conversation tonight about next steps and what else we need to do on his project). What we are proposing are two separate work nights, Tues 7/23 and Thurs 7/25 from 7pm-9pm to remove items from the attic. No modifications to the ductwork would be done at this time (Luke - you, me, your papa, and a smaller group of volunteers can work on the removal of the ductwork *after* the trash and other furniture items in the attic are removed and disposed of).

As Luke said, we would like to clean up any items that are in salvageable shape and have Scouts bring those items (chairs, etc.) down to the curb and put signs on them saying "Free", hoping that they will get picked up. If we can bring down all items that people might want on Tuesday, anything still remaining by Thursday we can put in the dumpster, along with whatever other stuff is left in the attic. Our goal is to have all the junk in the attic completely removed this month so that in August we can focus on removing the ductwork, repairing the floor and window exhaust, and replacing the circle room door. Any volunteers on the two proposed workdays could bring cardboard, tape, Sharpies, work gloves, and dustpans/brooms.

I can help Luke craft an email to reach out to the troop asking for help to clarify what type of help we're asking for. I hope this helps clear things up!
